





Television

When did you get your first television set?

Do you recall how much you paid for your television?

What are your favourite programmes?

What was the most memorable event you watched on TV?

Watching TV was a family event, everyone would gather together around the television set to watch their favourite programmes. The BBC dominated TV from 1936 and was then joined by ITV in 1955. The Queen's Coronation in 1953 saw a huge rise in the sales of TV sets, as everyone wanted to watch this historic event.

As well as TV shutting down at midnight, TV also had to stop transmission between 6.00pm and 7.00pm. This policy was called "The Toddler Truce"- signalling the end of the children's TV schedule, before the evening programmes started. It gave parents the perfect opportunity to put their young children to bed.

An early popular panel game on TV was "What's My Line?". "Opportunity Knocks" presented by Hughie Green was also an enjoyed entertainment show. The soap lovers preferred the iconic long-running soap, "Coronation Street", tuning in to watch the razor-sharp tongued Ena Sharples in her trademark hairnet.

Being able to watch the World Cup in 1966 was a must for over 32 million people. Other popular events to watch included the Moon Landing in 1969 and Billie Jean King's triumph at the Wimbledon Women's Singles in 1967.

Dream Car Challenge

Pedal cars—miniature versions for kids—started out as toys for wealthy children, but they were widely available by the 1950s. Many of the toy cars had features just like the full-size models, including working lights, ragtops, whitewall tires, and hood ornaments. Today, an original 1955 Chevrolet pedal car would fetch about \$1,750.
